

Exercise 3. Say what action was done before. Combine the two sentences into one. Use **before**.

Example: I *sent* a letter. Then I *met* my friend. → I *had sent* a letter *before* I *met* my friend).

1. The rain stopped.  
Then I went for a walk.
  2. I did my homework. Then I saw the film.
  3. We met in the street.  
Then we went to the park.
  4. We came to the cinema.  
Then the film began.
  5. I cleaned the flat.  
Then my friends came.
1. The rain **had stopped** **before** I **went** for a walk.
  2. I had done my homework before I saw the film.
  3. We **had met** in the street **before** we **went** to the park.
  4. We **had come** to the cinema **before** the film **began**.
  5. I **had cleaned** the flat **before** my friends **came**.
